Example: We first met at university.

4. Where are they from?

Example: They are from a town near London.

5. What do they look like?

Example: They have curly dark hair and a friendly smile.

6. What are they interested in?

Example: They are interested in photography and travel.

7. Have you ever had an argument? What was it about?

Example: Yes, we once argued about a holiday plan, but we talked about it later.

8. What do you have in common?

Example: We both enjoy cooking and watching films.

9. In what ways are you different?

Example: They are very organised, but I am more relaxed.

10. Is it easy to make new friends?

Example: It can be difficult, but joining a class is a good way to make new friends.

11. Would you lend a friend a large amount of money if they asked? Why or why not?

Example: I would lend a close friend some money if I could afford it and we agreed on a plan.

12. Which is more important to you: friends or family?

Example: Both are important, but I spend more time with my family.
