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Possible B2 answers: Notice how each response gives a clear idea and support.

1. What are some benefits of the internet?

Example: The internet makes information, education and communication available to people almost anywhere. It also helps small businesses reach customers without large advertising budgets.

2. What are some dangers of the internet?

Example: Dangers include misinformation, scams, privacy breaches and harmful content. People can also become isolated when online activity replaces face-to-face relationships.

3. How much time should children spend online?

Example: Children need limits that depend on their age and what they are doing online. Parents should focus on quality, safety and balance rather than only counting minutes.

4. How has the internet changed the world?

Example: The internet has transformed shopping, work, education and news. It has made global communication faster, although it has also changed how quickly false information spreads.

5. Which website or online service do you use most, and why?

Example: I use online maps and messaging services most because they solve everyday problems quickly. They help me organise plans and communicate without unnecessary delays.

6. Should governments control parts of the internet?

Example: Governments should act against serious crime and protect children, but broad control can threaten freedom of expression. Independent courts and clear laws are essential.

7. Are you concerned about having personal information online?

Example: I am concerned because personal data can be collected, sold or leaked without people fully understanding the consequences. I try to use strong passwords and limit what I share.

8. How would the world change if the internet stopped working?

Example: If the internet stopped working, businesses, schools and public services would face major disruption. People would need to return to slower forms of communication and record-keeping.
