A Different Way to Work

Ruby called her **manager**. She explained the problem and said she was going to walk. She had comfortable shoes, and the weather was sunny. She followed a **path** beside the river instead of walking along the main road.

On the way, she saw a small garden and a cafe. She did not know about these places before. She arrived at work after forty minutes. She was a little late, but her manager was not angry.

The next morning, Ruby left home fifteen minutes earlier. She walked along the same path. Now she walks to work twice a week. She still takes the bus when it rains, but she enjoys her new **route**.

path - a narrow way that people can walk along

route - the way you take to get from one place to another
