USEFUL LANGUAGE

1. take stock of	carefully assess a situation before deciding what to do	We paused to take stock of the project's progress.
2. scale back	reduce the size or extent of something	The organisers scaled back the event to stay within budget.
3. phase out	gradually stop using or providing something	The library is phasing out its old booking system.
4. spread yourself too thin	try to do too many things to do them well	I spread myself too thin by joining four committees.
5. cut corners	skip necessary steps to save time or money (disapproving)	The contractor cut corners and the repairs soon failed.
6. pull your weight	do your fair share of the work	Every volunteer needs to pull their weight.
7. a bottleneck	a point that slows the progress of a whole process	One approval stage became a bottleneck for every order.
8. in the long run	over a long period rather than immediately	Better training should save time in the long run.
